- 2. Read **1 John 2:15-17**. In what way does our preoccupation with the world's priorities reflect the same kind of problem we just considered in Genesis 3 when thinking about Adam and Eve's sin?
- 3. Read **Luke 18:22-25**. Describe a situation in your life when Christ was clearly calling you to prioritize your loyalty to him over the things of this world?
- 4. Read **Titus 1:16** and **Matthew 7:18-20**. What would you say to someone who tells you he is well-intentioned regarding his obedience to God (e.g., regarding things like church attendance [Heb.10:25] and evangelism [2Cor.5:20]), but he just has so many practical reasons that make those things impossible for him?
- 5. Read **Matthew 6:31-34**. What are some practical ways you will live out the truth of this passage this week?
