WCF Chapter 5. Of Providence. 1. And, to testify this our desire and assurance, we say, Amen.

**WLC Q. 62.** What is the visible Church? A. The visible Church is a society made up of all such as in all ages and places of the world do profess the true religion, and of their children. **WLC Q. 63.** What are the special privileges of the visible Church? A. The visible Church hath the privilege of being under God's special care and government; of being protected and preserved in all ages, notwithstanding the opposition of all enemies; and of enjoying the communion of saints, the ordinary means of salvation, and offers of grace by Christ to all the members of it in the ministry of the gospel, testifying, that whosoever believes in him shall be saved, and excluding none that will come unto him. **WLC Q. 166.** Unto whom is Baptism to be administered? A. Baptism is not to be administered to any that are out of the visible Church, and so strangers from the covenant of promise, till they profess their faith in Christ, and obedience to him; but

infants descended from parents, either both or but one of them professing faith in Christ,

and obedience to him, are in that respect, within the covenant, and to be baptized.
