5 Truths

...regarding justification that we do well to see clearly

I. Justification by faith is a very big deal & is worthy of our diligent _____.

Romans 1. “(16) For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God into salvation to everyone who is believing, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. (17) For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith...”

II. This justification comes to us through _____, & by faith in Him alone.

Romans 5:1. “Having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

Romans. “(3:21) But now apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been manifested . . . (22) even the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ . . . (4:5) to the one who does not work, but believes in Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is credited as righteousness,”

A Definition: “Justification is an instantaneous legal act of God in which He, (1) decides to think of our sins as forgiven and Christ’s righteousness as belonging to us, and (2) declares us to be righteous in His sight.” (Wayne Grudem)

Romans 5:9. “having now been justified by His blood”

Romans 5:18. “So then as through one transgression there resulted condemnation to all men, even so through one act of righteousness there resulted justification of life to all men.”

Romans 4:25. “He [Christ] was . . . raised for our justification.”
