## Aliens are Just Here to Help by Fred DeRuvo - Study-Grow-Know Ministries

The subject of alien encounters is one that is either believed outright by the zealous or seriously questioned by the doubter. There are pools of people who warmly receive whatever is stated by entities from other realms and dimensions as *truth*. These individuals firmly believe that aliens are here to do us a *favor*. They are seen as altruistic and loving.

Aliens, it is said, have been slowly revealing themselves to humanity in order to gain our trust. They seek to aid us through this very difficult period of our earthly history in order to bring us to a point of *self-sufficiency*, beyond wars, hatred, and especially the narrow-mindedness that is often revealed through a variety of religious endeavors. Many of these endeavors are described as *legalistic*.

Of course, it goes without saying that in all cases, Christianity is the single most attacked religion on the face of the planet. It is usually described by aliens as being completely misunderstood, and therefore, misappropriated.

Depending upon the type of alien that is doing the teaching, Jesus either *did* exist, but His reputation was completely blown out of proportion, or He did not exist and was merely a holographic image created by these higher beings in order to instruct us. Some aliens speak a great deal about the use of holograms as instruments of instruction for the human race.

In any case, the intended result is to *denigrate* Christianity and to cause the hearer(s) to doubt what they have always heard about Jesus and Christianity. It is interesting that people will question the Bible without mercy, in spite of any proof provided as to its veracity. However, when an alien being (who, by the way, is *never* asked or expected to offer proof as to his real identity) comes along and promotes the idea that Jesus was something else entirely, or that Christianity is merely the result of wishful thinking on the part of the original twelve, these words alone are sufficient enough to be accepted as *truth*. People sit in awe of these beings, hanging on every word, as messages are channeled through human beings to their audience, which waits with baited breath for new revelation.

What is equally troubling though is that people tend to believe what Hollywood produces, either consciously or unconsciously. In our first chapter, we discussed aspects of the movie *Knowing*, starring Nicolas Cage as John, an astrophysicist who comes into possession of a sheet of paper filled with rows of numbers that seemingly make no sense. John is able to

break the code and begins to understand that major catastrophic events occurring on planet earth have either been simply known about or planned. In either case, the aliens have wanted to gain the attention of certain chosen ones on planet earth.

The reason aliens have decided to interfere by contacting chosen individuals is so that they can answer the call to be taken to another earth-like planet where life can begin all over again. Hopefully, all mistakes made on this planet will be left here to die with it.

The overwhelming question is: why would aliens be concerned at all with what occurs on this planet? The answer – though implied in the movie – is that these aliens either had a hand in creating (seeding) life on this planet to begin with, or their continued existence is somehow connected to humanity's continued existence. It has an evolutionary thread throughout in which all life is connected. It could also be that the producers of the movie simply wanted to portray aliens as benevolent, rather than malevolent.

If one recalls the history of alien movies and books since the early days of Hollywood, we learn that by and large, aliens were seen as diabolical, or even overtly evil. They came to destroy, to take over, and to push us out.

Think of the many movies from the 40s, 50s, and 60s. Movies like *Invasion of the Body Snatchers, The Beast from 20,000 Fathoms, The Day the Earth Stood Still, When Worlds Collide, The War of the Worlds,* and a host of other movies that portrayed aliens as villains.

Whether the movie had a *supernatural*, a *scientific*, or an *extra-terrestrial* overtone, it was clear that whatever came to earth, whether from underneath from the sea, or above from the skies, did so with evil intentions. Serials as far back as the 30s featured space ranger Flash Gordon fighting Ming the Merciless. In short, there was nothing good about alien life forms from these early days.

Over the passing decades, malicious aliens continued to exist in Hollywood, but they also began to portray decidedly good qualities. The Queen Alien in the *Alien* trilogy starring Sigourney Weaver was simply a mother out to protect her hatchlings. Yes, that mother had acid for blood and jaws that split skulls, but ultimately, she was protecting what was hers and would stand for no interference from anything or anyone. Even humans will do that to protect their offspring.

Alongside these movies, films like *Star Wars* and a rebooted *Star Trek* made their way to the silver screens. These films showed that intelligent life forms existed beyond our solar system and they were not always bad. In fact, in some ways, the bad was clearly delineated from the good. "The Force" has become a phrase that is part of the vernacular of everyday language and mirrors what is taught within aspects of the New Age movement.

As time has marched on, aliens have become more human-like, with emotions, design, and superior intelligence. *If only we would trust them*, is their message. To this end, aliens have taken on forms that we can understand and appreciate. They stoop to our level so as not to frighten us. They simply want to be friends, or at least to gain our trust so that we will be able to discern the intelligence of their *plan*.

Like parents who chide their children and even keep certain things hidden from them because of the child's inability to comprehend it, so too do aliens do what is necessary for our growth, though we fail at times to truly comprehend *why* they do *what* they do. As children who place their trust in parents, so too should we abandon doubt in order to trust the direction that the aliens seem to be taking us.

Because of the fact that alien abductions by their nature are often harrowing, leaving the abductee with severe trauma, aliens have attempted to portray themselves as doctors and scientists, simply doing what they have to do to achieve their purposes for humankind. Because of this, alien abductions have become much more readily accepted in many circles today. The fear factor that is usually involved in alien abductions is dissolving and there are actually folks who *seek* to be abducted.

Of course, alien abductions can still be frightening, as much of the testimony from abductees explains. However, since these aliens are now seen as physicians and scientists, what was once extremely fearful is now becoming much more passively accepted.

In spite of all the movies that portray aliens as hellions from outer space out to destroy, there has never been a recorded incident of aliens attempting to do this on this planet. For the most part, aliens are seen as *observing* our planet and the situations that evolve. They are portrayed as needing to step in when necessary to either correct things that may destroy the earth if left unchecked, or to simply help us gain access to the next *spiritual* level.

It is the latter reason that is discussed most today. Aliens are good and want only the best for us. To this end, they endeavor to step in only when absolutely necessary to help us arrive to a spiritual plane that they themselves once stood at eons ago.

What we often mistake as malevolence, then, is in truth their way of helping us achieve. We mistake their help for hindrance, simply because it has taken so long to get to know them.

Even in many cases of alien abductions, the tremendous fear experienced by the abductee is generally seen as an overreaction to the *unknown*. Many abductees speak of being immobilized and completely unable to move, yet able to feel things acutely, while hearing (through telepathy) the thoughts of their alien abductors.

Being literally yanked out of their beds and into a place that appears to be cold, sterile, and alien, while being poked and prodded by alien creatures, is enough to cause any normal human being to become carried away with abject fear. These types of situations, whether real or in the mind's eye, are intense and therefore completely realistic and altogether unknown. Since the abductee has no frame of reference for the event, fear speaks loudly and clearly. Of course, the fear of *future unknown* also plays a large part in these abductions. What is the intent of these aliens? Are they friendly? How is that measured with beings that show little to no emotion? What will they do once the examination is completed? Will I be different? Will I remember this event? Will I have nightmares that are as vivid as the event itself? Will they return to abduct me *again*?

All of these questions speed through the mind of the abductee with no corresponding answer. At the very least, it leaves the abductee unnerved and vulnerable. At worst, it creates an abductee who becomes schizophrenic.

If history tells us anything, we can clearly see that alien abductions have become much more normalized in society today. We realize that over many decades, alien abductions, like out of body experiences, have taken on a sense of credibility that was lacking when they first began in the United States.
