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One Main Point: Faith that doesn't bear fruit, doesn't save souls.

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Faith That Works

A Silly Claim, a Forceful Reply

- "But faith and works can be separated!"

Interruption by James: "Please, show me how that works—authenticate your life of faith without fruitfulness, I'll authenticate mine *by* my fruitfulness and we'll see how it goes. Only my approach will demonstrate anything about the true nature of my faith. Why, you ask?"

An example—the orthodox demons

Faith That Works

- Showing that faith without works is useless (vs. 20)
 - o What James is *not* showing:
 - How to be saved from one's sin
 - How to be *declared perfect in Christ* before God
 - How to achieve or come to possess saving faith itself
 - How good works merit God's favor in salvation
 - James is showing that while faith and obedience (works) can be *conceptually* separated, they can't be *actually* separated in the life of (saving) faith.

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- o Abraham, justified by works (vs. 21) ■ 'justified' and Gen. 22
 - Gr. dikaioō coming out of Judaism | To discern and pronounce one to be *morally upright—righteous*—as a matter of judgment (cf. 1 Kgs. 8:31-32; Job. 1:1; Mic. 6:11; Matt. 5:20; 12:37; 25:33-40)

■ Faith + works—but to what end?

•Gen. 15:6 | "counted to him as righteousness" oFaith*fulness fulfills* faith—the *fulfill*ment of faith is faith*fulness*

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Gen 15:6, Gen. 22; Jas. 2:21-23 taken in tandem

- Abraham's works were such that he could genuinely be pronounced an upright, righteous man (Gen. 15:6; Jas. 2:21-23), a kind of man who would, therefore, stand in the judgment (Ps. 1), his prior faith and God's declaration of righteousness over him (Gen. 15:6) having found its full expression in obedience.
 - oJames's supporting point: Works can't be separated from faith because they both *authenticate* and *fulfill* living faith the only kind that faith that saves from judgment. ➤The overlooked climax: a friend of God!
