"Egypt's Salvation and Joseph's Inheritance" (Genesis 47:13–48:22)

## Big Idea: Though Joseph mediates blessing to Egypt, God's blessings promised to Joseph are far better.

- I. The Story in the Text
  - a. Joseph saves the Egyptians from the prolonged famine. (47:13–28)
    - i. Joseph shows wisdom and mercy in providing for the destitute Egyptians. (47:13–26)
    - ii. While the Egyptians lost their land to Pharaoh, Israel prospered in the land of Goshen. (47:27–28)
  - b. Jacob speaks to Joseph before dying. (47:29–48:22)
    - i. Jacob gets Joseph's sworn promise to bury him with his fathers in Canaan. (47:29–31)
    - ii. Jacob adopts Joseph's two sons as Rachel's sons. (48:1–7)
    - iii. Jacob pronounces the firstborn blessing on Joseph's two sons. (48:8–20)
    - iv. Jacob points Joseph to the promised land and Joseph's inheritance there. (48:21–22)
