

Aliens Tell Us We are Gods

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With everything that is being written about aliens and with the way they are being portrayed now in Hollywood, the question must be asked: *what is the truth and is there any way to determine what that truth is in the end?*

We must not forget to include beings that are commonly referred to as “ascended masters” or “spirit guides.” Though these are often unseen even to the person who channels their messages and ideas to humanity, they are still in some form *alien* life to humans on this planet.

We normally think of aliens in terms of space beings piloting spacecraft or possessing some way to transverse space and possibly even time without a craft. One of the things that many aliens allegedly do is use telepathy to engage their subject’s mind. It is through this ability that many books have been written by those who claim to have friends in the alien world, or other dimensions.

This author has been contacted by several individuals who have claimed to be channelers for beings from other dimensions. It normally follows that they insist that what they are doing is biblical and the beings they deal with only have good intentions for the world. They point out that statements made in my books or on my blog are very narrow-minded and judgmental.

When asked to provide proof of their claims and proof of the identity of the beings who channel messages to them, they are unable to do so and say as much. They indicate that it is impossible to know who the beings *truly* are, but since their message is one of comfort and love, then to question their motives is unnecessary as the message speaks for itself, regardless of the source of that message.

Is that true? Are we to simply take as truth any thought, word, book, or movie that comes to us if it *appears* to have some semblance of truth to it and if it is delivered with an attitude of compassion and peace? It would seem that we do not do this with other human beings, yet we are being told that we should not hesitate to do this with aliens.

In this author’s mind, there is virtually no difference between an alien who abducts someone and plants ideas or concepts in their mind and an ascended master who does the same using some type of telepathy. How can there be any difference if the messages are fundamentally the same? Only the source and circumstances are different, but how are we to know that aliens cannot create images that appear extremely realistic? In short, we do not.

Whether they are ascended masters, aliens, higher beings, spirit guides, or whatever else they are called, the message is essentially the same. Only the delivery of that message and the circumstances surrounding that delivery are different from one person to the next.

In the end, then, are we really dealing with aliens, ascended masters, higher beings, or something else entirely? Is that simply how they refer to themselves, or what they encourage us to believe? It seems that all too often, what we call them does not matter, and they say as much. It is the *message* that we need to grasp, live by, and share. The message they present will open doors that our subconscious will create. All that is needed is to walk through those doors they unlock into that reality they describe. We are told that people are too often imprisoned by their own lack of creativity; that we have long given up on the idea that gods can *create*. It is the aliens' job to reunite us with this "gift" of creation in order to make this world a better place.

Ultimately, the world becomes better and evolves to its next spiritual level when all human beings grasp the same *goal*. Maybe it's just me, but it appears as though there is essentially *one overriding* message that emanates from the alien world, but which is transmitted in *numerous* to human beings in many different ways. While there seems at times to be many messages that are routinely bandied about from the alien world to this one, few seem to realize that some messages within the overall message are contradictive in nature. It is as if people hear what they want to hear and toss out anything that does not agree with their preconceived notion of what aliens are like and what they want us to know.

The point is that any number of messages emanate from the alien world; however, all are under one main heading. It all depends upon what alien is making the statement and from what branch of alien or culture he allegedly hails.

The generalized message from the alien world is essentially the same. It is their hope and desire to bring humanity to a higher level of existence. This is accomplished, they say, by helping human beings unlock their true potential. Inwardly, we are told, human beings are already gods. We possess everything that is needed to achieve whatever our minds can conceive. This one main message is fine-tuned by various other-worldly entities depending upon the specific humans or groups of humans to which they are relating their ideas.

Throughout this book, it must be realized that many movies and books have been produced and published that do not speak of or refer to aliens specifically. However, they do refer to and illuminate other *dimensions*. *The Matrix* trilogy is one such vehicle that introduced

people to an “awake” world and a “dream” world. In that scenario, people actually existed in huge vats of chemicals that allowed the electricity their brains produced to be harvested and used by aliens of a type. They were actually machines that had outgrown the need for human beings except as a source of energy.

Human beings, while asleep in their own chemical vat, lived a life that seemed in all respects to be fully real to them. They were only dreaming, however, and yet the vividness of their dreams rivaled anything in reality.

It was when they began to fight their dream world, while fully involved in their dream reality, that they learned of the ability to move out from their dream world by waking up to their actual reality.
