Catalyst Group Discussion Questions - Hosea 2:2-23 Week of September 25, 2011

The second chapter of Hosea contains a call to God's adulterous people to return to him or face his discipline. Yet the passage is not all warnings, discipline and doom. God graciously shows how much he loves His people and what He is willing to do to win them back.

Discussion

• To what extreme would you be willing to go in order to reconcile someone who had been unfaithful to you back?

Examination

- Who or what did Israel believe made them so prosperous?
- What kinds of discipline does God promise on his people for their unfaithfulness?
- How does spiritual adultery demonstrate itself in day-to-day living?
- What kinds of redemption and love does God promise to bestow on his people?


Application
