"Our Great King and High Priest" Zechariah 6:9-15

A Symbolic Transaction

A symbolic transaction teaching God's people to wait for the Savior to come.

1. The Symbolic Act: The Crowning of Joshua the High Priest

- (1) A Gift from Afar!
 - Gold and Silver
 - Brought from Babylon by a Deputation of Jews
 - Representative of those who had sent them and of God's purpose
 - Heldai "endurance"? → v. 14 Helem "strength"
 - Tobijah "the goodness of Jehovah" or "Jehovah is my good"
 - Jediah "Jehovah knows"
 - Josiah "Jehovah is my support" → v. 14 Hen "grace"
 - Zephaniah (Josiah's father) "Jehovah protects"
 - A crown fashioned "make a crown"
 - Lit.: "crowns" or "an ornate crown"
- (2) A Coronation "a prophetic pageant"
 - Joshua the High Priest crowned
 - To be viewed as representative here viewed in his office as High Priest
 - The words to be pronounced over him are prophetic: a picture of Messiah presented
 - The crown permanently hung in the Temple
- 2. Its Meaning: A Revelation of the Messiah who was to come.
 - (1) Messiah to be Invested with Kingly Power
 - The two offices of King and Priest to be joined in Him!
 - (2) Messiah a Description
 -1- His Obscure Origin

"Thus says the LORD of hosts,

'Behold, the man whose name is the Branch,
for he shall branch out from his place'"

- He would not openly descend from heaven, in a visible show of glory, but would grow up out of the earth in lowly humiliation.

- -2- His Great Work "he shall build the temple of the LORD"
 - Repeated twice for emphasis
 - Cf. Eph. 2:19-20
- -3- His Kingly Glory "(he) shall bear royal honor, and shall sit and rule on his throne"
 - "he shall sit" securely and permanently
- -4- King and Priest!

"And there shall be a priest on his throne,

and the counsel of peace shall be between them both"

- The union of both offices in Christ in the work of salvation
- "the counsel that produces peace"
- A priest after the order of Melchizedek Ps. 110:4

(3) The Token of His Coming and of the Final Triumph of His Kingdom

"And the crown shall be in the temple of the LORD

- The Crown hung in the temple

as a reminder..."

- The promise of Messiah to come Jesus the King-Priest
- Its metals having been brought from afar from Babylon:
- To foretell the promised final crushing of Satan's dominion of Satan's dominion "And those who are far off shall come and help to build the temple of the LORD."
- To foreshadow the bringing in of the Gentiles into the church
- (4) The Call to the Faith and Obedience "And you shall know

that the LORD of hosts has sent me to you.

- Who believed the promise? And this shall come to pass if you will

diligently obey the voice of the LORD your God."

- Not calling for some 'extraordinary' obedience!

Simply true obedience – such obedience which attends true faith.
