In this world of sin and death, the more I'm consciously thankful to God for all he gives and the more I actively trust God who is sovereign over every event, the more whole I'll be as a human because fearing God is the purpose for which I'm made.

 - Proverbs is about fearing God (Prov. 1:7).
 - Job is about fearing God (Job 28:28).
 - Ecclesiastes is about fearing God (12:13).

Proverbs teaches God's way to blessing, Job teaches that serving God doesn't necessarily lead to blessing, and Ecclesiastes teaches that God's blessings are not to be sought as gods.
