CONFESSIO OF FAITH XXVIII. OF BAPTISM.

I. Baptism is a sacrament of the New Testament, ordained by Jesus Christ, not only for the solemn admission of the party baptized into the visible church, but also to be unto him a sign and seal of the covenant of grace, of his ingrafting into Christ, of regeneration, of remission of sins, and of his giving up unto God through Jesus Christ, to walk in newness of life: which sacrament is, by Christ's own appointment, to be continued in his church until the end of the world. **II.** The outward element to be used in this sacrament is water, wherewith the party is to be baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, by a minister of the gospel, lawfully called thereunto. **III.** Dipping of the person into the water is not necessary; but baptism is rightly administered by pouring or sprinkling water upon the person.

LARGER CATECHISM Q. 171.

HOW ARE THEY THAT RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT OF THE LORD'S SUPPER TO PREPARE THEMSELVES BEFORE THEY COME UNTO IT?

A. They that receive the sacrament of the Lord's supper are, before they come, to prepare themselves thereunto, by examining themselves of their being in Christ, of their sins and wants; of the truth and measure of their knowledge, faith, repentance; love to God and the brethren, charity to all men, forgiving those that have done them wrong; of their desires after Christ, and of their new obedience; and by renewing the exercise of these graces, by serious meditation, and fervent prayer.
