Introduction:

How do you recognize a HUMBLE man? He's marked by his enthrallment with God & his diminishing of self.

Background to 2 Chron 26

- Tonight we come to the 3rd part of a Trilogy. We could call it the Trilogy of Those who TURN away from God. They start well but end bad [1. <u>Joash</u>, 24.20; **2.** <u>Amaziah</u>, 25:16; and now **3.** <u>Uzziah</u>, 26:16].
- We might summarize 2 Chronicles 26 (on Uzziah): the prosperity, the pride, & the plummet of Uzziah.

THESIS — We'll study 2 Chron 26 together & we'll embrace 3 factors that we must understand to guard from the heart-sin of PRIDE.

I.UNDERSTAND GOD'S GRACE! (1-15)

Note the simple summary v.5b - "God prospered him"

A.God's equipping of a man (1-5)

B.God's prospering of a man (6-15)

2 Chronicles 26 — "The Power of Pride to Take You Down in Humiliating Shame: The Reign of King Uzziah"

II.UNDERSTAND PRIDE'S ROOT (16)

Pride: the sin in the heart that shifts confidence FROM GOD to SELF. The great evil of **pride** is that it seeks to UN-god God.

4 ways that PRIDE is described here...

- 1. The **SITUATION** of his pride (16a)
- 2. The **SOURCE** of his pride (16b)
- 3. The **SUPREMACY** of his pride (16c)
- 4. The **SHAME** of his pride (16d)

Consider the prophet **Obadiah** —

III. UNDERSTAND SIN'S CALAMITY (17-23)

Pride leads to downfall (Prov 11.2). The pride of man will be humbled (Isa 2.17)

Mark this -- we cannot judge *how* God is to be worshiped! We don't know better than God!

- •We **can't** reinvent or reshape *HOW* God is to be worshiped. He's clearly laid it forth in Scripture. As New Testament believers, God has commanded us to preach, to sing, to pray, to fellowship, to evangelize, to guard sound doctrine, to praise our Triune God.
- •GOD made his law very clear as to WHAT his worship was to be like
- We are NOT at liberty to devise new forms of worship that are NOT in Scripture.
- •God has commanded us to preach, to sing, to pray, to fellowship, to evangelize, to guard sound doctrine.
- •***UZZIAH'S GREAT SIN WAS THE ARROGANCE OF THINKING THAT HE KNEW BETTER THAN GOD.
- His pride was typical of many leaders.
- •He thought his genius and ingenuity enabled them to reform the church/people of God more into his liking.
- 1. Sin makes you stupid (17-20a)
- 2. Sin brings God's judgment (20b)

3. Sin has destructive consequences (21-23)

- **√WALLOW** in divine grace
- **✓WELCOME** loving reproof

SCRIPTURES ON PERSEVERING TILL THE END (from Hebrews)

- ✓ Heb 3:14 we must **hold fast** the beginning of our assurance firm until the end
- √ Heb 4.1 don't come short of the promise of entering HIS rest
- √Heb 4:11 let us be diligent to enter that rest, so that no one will fall...
- ✓ Heb 6.11 and we desire that each one of you show the same diligence so as to realize the **full assurance** of hope until the end ... so that you will NOT be sluggish...
- ✓ Heb 12:15 see to it that no one comes short of the grace of God...
- ✓ Heb 10:36 for you have need of **endurance**, so that when you have done the will of God, you may receive what was promised.

Ultimately, how do we NOT become proud & lifted up in our hearts?

Most preeminently & gloriously: **ZOOM IN ON CHRIST!**
