Introduction

- I. Because Christians are the most forgiven people, we should be the most forgiving.
- II. What the text emphasizes in the pattern as Christ forgave you, so also do ye.

Peacemakers: (6)Forgiving, As Christ Forgives Us

- I. What? When there is conflict, the way to reconciliation is forgiveness.
 - A. Forgiveness is a decision and a promise that you will not hold sin against someone else.
 - 1. The pattern of true forgiveness is set by God Himself in Christ, as the text says.
 - 2. The four promises of forgiveness:
 - B. This decision to forgive is not cheap, but costly.
 - 1. Forgiveness is not cheap, but it is costly because when we sin we create a debt.
 - 2. So also for us, forgiveness is costly.
 - C. Forgiveness is a gracious activity.
 - 1. God's forgiveness in Jesus Christ is a gracious work of God.
 - 2. Those who know God's gracious forgiveness, will also forgive graciously.

II. When?

- A. The Scriptures make clear that the promises of forgiveness are only given to those who confess their sins and ask to be forgiven for their sins.
- B. The text emphasizes that forgiveness is an ongoing promise.

III. How?

- A. We cannot forgive others in our own strength, but we need hearts transformed by God.
- B. We may struggle with the remembrance of what others have done against us.
