- IV. The physical therapy (vs. 12-15)
 - A. He is diligent and the work will be done in His perfect time. Everything on His to-do list will be done and it will be done RIGHT & PERFECTLY.
 - 1. The promise of the Holy Spirit is to His church.

 - 2. The gift of the Holy Spirit ensures this one thing:
