Lesson 2. Serious Sacrifices and Generous Rewards

Matthew 10:34-42

- I. <u>A SWORD THAT DIVIDES</u> (34-36; Gen 3:15; Mal 3:1-3)—"I did not come to bring peace but a sword"
 - A. The Cost of Peace—War before Peace
 - 1. <u>Promise of Peace</u> (Isa 30:15; Heb 2:8)—*Ultimately the Messiah will establish a kingdom of peace, but first He must subdue His enemies*
 - 2. False Peace (Jer 8:11)—Avoiding conflict is not the same thing as establishing peace
 - 3. <u>Fighting for Peace</u> (Gen 3:15; Isa 32:17; 57:20-21)—there can be no peace without righteousness
 - B. The Reality of Enemies (36)—Yes, you do have enemies. Don't be naïve!
 - **1.** <u>Intimacy of Enemies</u> (Ps 41:9; Mic 7:4b-6)—*betrayal assumes a preexisting bond* Conflicting loyalties will divide the world and be serious enough to *split families*.
 - 2. Love of Enemies (Mat 5:44; Col 1:21-22)
- II. <u>A PRIORITY OF AFFECTIONS</u> (37-38) "Whoever loves father or mother more than me..." Even the humans who are most naturally dear to you *must not occupy the place of God* in your life.
 - **A.** <u>Transcending Natural Relationships</u>—Family of origin is the strongest naturally occurring bond in human society.
 - 1. Father and Mother—the first and most essential bond a human infant experiences.
 - 2. Son or Daughter—chronologically our first identity
 - **B.** <u>Avoiding Relational Idolatry</u>—Anything that keeps you from whole-hearted devotion to Jesus is an idol.
- III. <u>A PICTURE OF DISCIPLESHIP</u> (38-39) "Whoever does not take up his cross and follow me..."

- A. Relinquishing Control (Luke 22:42; John 21:18)
- B. **Embracing the Cross**—Jesus does not encourage fair-weather followers!
 - 1. Shame (Heb 12:2) loss of respect, social status, reputation...
 - 2. <u>Pain</u>—physical, emotional, relational, etc...
 - **3.** <u>Death</u> (Ps 44:22; Rom 12:1)—*loss of life as you know it* Possible martyrdom; definitely death to self—*my independence, comfort, control and self-focus*

C. Finding Life

- **1. Abundant Life Now**—Joy and purpose with Him now no matter what; without Him, nothing in the world can satisfy.
- **2. Eternal Life to Come**—Unending life with Jesus in New Heavens and Earth, with no more sin, sickness, sorrow, toil or danger
- IV. A PROMISE OF REWARD (40-42; Heb 11:6) Faith in God involves believing He rewards
 - **A.** <u>Receiving Jesus by Proxy</u>—accepting, welcoming, befriending, helping, supporting or extending hospitality
 - **1. Identifying with Jesus**—identifying with someone based on their character and reputation as a follower of Christ—you revere the One they represent
 - **2. Receiving One Another**—in persecution and right now in fellowship

B. Heaven's Measure of Worth

- 1. <u>Little is Big</u>. *Little ones and little things are significant.*
 - a. <u>Little Ones</u>—those considered weak, insignificant, despised by the world
 - **b.** <u>Little Things</u>—small acts of kindness, even a cup of cold water
- 2. Motive is Key. Small acts of kindness inspired by great love for Jesus are huge.
- C. Being Worthy of Jesus (37-38)—valuing Jesus correctly.
 - 1. The Ability of Jesus to Repay (Phil 4:19)
 - 2. The Friendship of Jesus Himself (Ps 63:3)
