#### Hannah: Infertile and Unhappy

(1 Samuel 1:1 - 2:11)

# **I. <u>THE PRACTICE OF POLYGAMY</u>**—having more than one wife at a time

## A. Reasons for it

- **1. For Children**—*resource and legacy*
- **2. For Attraction**—*if first wife wasn't satisfying*
- 3. For Status—required wealth, promoted alliances
- **4. Female Dependence**—*needed identity, provision and protection*
- 5. Male Privilege—because they could
- **B.** <u>Problems with it</u> —Scripture *never portrays it as a good situation.* 
  - 1. Not God's Design (Gen 2:24; Mat 19:3-6)—demeans women, marriage
  - 2. Rivalry between wives (1:6; Gen 30:8)—Peninnah's bullying
  - 3. Conflict within the family—children drawn into it

# II. THE ANGUISH OF INFERTILITY ()

- A. <u>A Woman's Worth</u> (Luke 1:28)—*respect for producing male children*
- **B.** <u>A Woman's Desire</u> (1:7-8)—both husband and children
  - 1. A husband can never be everything.
  - 2. You can't <u>shame</u> someone into being happy.
  - 3. Sadness is part of life.
- C. <u>God's Sovereignty</u> (1:5; Gen 30:2; Ps 139:13-16)
  - 1. God's Plan (Ps 127:3-5)—No human life except by decree of God
  - **2. God's Power** (Gen 4:1; 1 Sam 1:27)—*God's assistance is necessary for us to fulfill our destiny/calling/desire.*
  - **3.** God's Attention (1:19-20)—even when He says no

# III. THE WORSHIP OF GOD

- A. <u>Community Obligation</u> (Deut 12:5-7; Heb 10:25)—It's not about you.
- **B.** <u>Family Worship</u> (Mat 5:23-24; Lev 25:17; 1 Pet 3:7)—*The way we treat one another in the family either honors or offends God*.
- C. <u>Individual Prayer</u>—We may go directly to God in prayer.
  - <u>Hannah's Fervency</u> (1:10-11, 13, 16)
    **a. Pouring out her heart** (Job 16:20; Ps 10:17; 62:8; 142:2)
    *Bitterness of heart poured out to the LORD is an act of worship.* **b. Making a vow**—*evidence that God had purified her motive*
  - 2. <u>Eli's Assumption</u> (1:12-16)—*that she was drunk*
  - 3. <u>Eli's Blessing</u> (1:17-18)—God's notice and favor comforts Hannah

### IV. THE COMFORT OF JESUS

- A. <u>He is our Great High Priest.</u> (Heb 4:15-16 & 7:25; 2 Cor 1:20; Rom 8:32) Ultimate proof/assurance of God's attention and favor
- B. <u>He Has Established Our Value.</u>
  - 1. Set by the price Jesus paid for each woman (Gal 3:26-28; 1 Pet 1:18-19)
  - Affirmed by the <u>way Jesus treated</u> women (Lk Lk 1:34-35 & 10:39, 42; John 4:27; Rom 16:1; Phil 4:3)
- C. <u>He Makes Us Supernaturally Fruitful</u> (Isa 54:1; 56:3-5; Jn 1:12-13, 3:3-6, 15:5; Rom 9:8)
  - **1.** <u>Regeneration</u>, not procreation, is the emphasis of the NT. Every generation of the church needs to be converted.
  - **2.** Christianity recognizes and honors <u>singleness</u>. (Mat 19:10-12; Acts 21:8-9; 1 Cor 7:1, 7)—*a special gift of grace to the church*
  - **3. Fruitfulness is <u>not limited</u> to the bearing and nurture of children.** (Gen 1:27-28; Jud 5:7)

- 6. In the Old Testament, infertility was considered a curse and a great personal disgrace. Are people who are unable to bear children second rate in the sight of God? (Consider the following passages: Isaiah 54:1; 56:3-5; and Matthew 19:11-12.)
- 7. Does God approve of Polygamy?
- 8. How does Jesus comfort us and bring us hope when we are criticized and insulted by others for our inadequacies? (Psalm 56:8; Hebrews 3:17-18; 4:15-16; 5:7-10)
- 9. If you are willing, please share a time when Jesus has either dramatically answered your prayer or ministered to you in the midst of an unmet desire.
