

## Salvation is about:

I. Satisfaction – "thou shalt make an altar" (v. 1)

Satisfaction that is: Leviticus 1:2-3

- A. Realized "If any man of you bring an offering"
- B. Righteous "a male without blemish"
- C. Required "that he may be accepted of the Lord"
- II. Substitution "thou shalt make the horns of it" (v. 2)

  Substitution requires: Leviticus 1:4
  - A. Action "he shall put his hand on... the burnt offering"
  - B. Acceptance "it shall be accepted for him"
  - C. Appeasement "to make atonement on his behalf"
- III. Sin "shovels...basons...flesh hooks...fire pans" (vs. 3-8)

  Sin:

  Leviticus 1:5-6
  - A. Slays -"he shall kill the bullock"
  - **B. Stains** "sprinkle the blood round about"
  - C. Separates "he shall flay...and cut it into his pieces"

## Sentence Sermon:

"Jesus died for us but more importantly He died in our place."
