Lesson 15: Prayerful Persistence and the Golden Rule

Matthew 7:7-12

I. <u>PRAYER IS HUMBLE</u>.

A. Acknowledge <u>Need</u>. Beggars or children assume a lesser role of dependency.

B. Acknowledge <u>God</u>. God is the one I depend upon for help, protection and provision.

C. Acknowledge <u>Questions</u>. (Dan 2:19-23; Jam 1:5) I don't know.

II. **PRAYER IS ACTIVE.** God's omniscience is not an excuse to not pray or not act!

- A. Asking is Active. (James 4:2b)
 - 1. Ask for Provision. "Give us this day our daily bread."
 - 2. Ask for the Work of His Spirit in Your Life. All the subjects Jesus has just covered in the Sermon on the Mount, He clearly expects us to pray about.
- **B.** <u>Seeking Is Active.</u> Contentment does not mean stagnation. There is a holy discontent, a righteous restlessness.
 - **1. Seek** <u>**God**</u>. (Jer 29:12-13) Seek a deeper relationship with Him—for *Himself*, not just what He can *give* you.
 - 2. Seek <u>Understanding</u>. (Prov 2:3-6) Of a person, situation, spiritual truth
 - **3.** Seek <u>Guidance</u>. (Isa 8:19-20) Don't just go your own way according to your own wisdom. Refusing to ask is *pride*.

- C. Knocking Is Active. Confident because we know who's there and sure of our reception
 - 1. Boldly Approach. (Heb 2:18, 4:15-16) Drop by God's house and knock on the door any time!
 - 2. Make Noise. (Mk 10:46-52) Don't be timid. You're not a nuisance to Him!

III. **PRAYER IS PERSISTENT** (present imperative verbs) *Keep on* asking, seeking, knocking!

A. It keeps on Pursuing.

- 1. Pursue the <u>Answer</u>. He may give you something better, but He will never give you something worse or inferior!
- 2. Pursue the <u>Relationship</u>. Our asking and His giving is relationship-building.
- **B.** <u>It doesn't Give Up</u>. (Gen 32:26) Sometimes the answer takes time or effort on our part. Sometimes God tests our resolve or redirects our prayer.

IV. **PRAYER IS ANSWERED** (9-11) Not an arbitrary spiritual exercise but necessary and effective

- **A.** <u>With Good Things</u> (9-10; Ps 103:5; James 1:17) God is the one who gives good and perfect gifts that satisfy our desires, renew our youth and don't bring regret.
- **B.** <u>By a Good Father</u> (11) He's rich, generous, knows what you need, loves to give good gifts and He loves you!
