Lesson D6. Even the DogsI

Matthew 15. (18-20) 21-28 (20-39), Ephesians 2.1-22

- I. THE WITHDRAWAL OF JESUS (21; Mk 7:31; Act 13:46-48; Isa 49:6)—Jesus left Jewish territory and *deliberately* went to the Gentiles.
 - A. The Abraham Connection (Gen 18:17-18 & 22:17-18)—promise of blessing
 - 1. The Land of Canaan (Gen 12:5-7; 13:15-17; 15:18)—promised to him & his offspring
 - 2. The Father of Multitudes (Gen 13:16; 15:5; 18:18)—a great nation, many nations
 - a. <u>Physical Descendents</u>—many nations descended from Abraham, not just Israel
 - b. <u>Spiritual</u> Descendents—Those Who Believe (Rom 4:16, 23-24; Gal 3:26-29)
 - → This Canaanite woman is a truer descendent of Abraham than were the Pharisees.
 - B. The Canaanite Connection—from Israel's History
 - 1. <u>Israel's Unfinished Conquest</u>—(Josh 13:1-5)—*Jesus is the Ultimate Joshua* Israel was not able to conquer the entire Promised Land during Joshua's lifetime.
 - 2. <u>Israel's Golden Years</u> (2 Sam 5:10-11)—*Jesus is the Greater David*Hiram King of Tyre supplied him with Cedars of Lebanon to build his royal palace.
 - **3.** <u>Israel's Wicked Kings</u> (1 Kings 6:29-33)—*Jesus is the Righteous King of Israel* King Ahab marries Sidonian princess and officially brings the worship of Baal to Israel.
- II. THE CRY OF THE WOMAN (22)
 - A. The Epitome Of Uncleanness
 - 1. A Woman
 - 2. A Gentile
 - B. A Model of Faith (28)—Jesus praises her and grants her request.
 - 1. Recognition (22; Mat 11:25-28; Jn 6:36-37, 44)—recognized Jesus as the Messiah
 - 2. <u>Humility</u> (25, 27)—contrast to the offended pride of people in Jesus' hometown
 - 3. Persistence (Mat 7:7-8; Gen 32:26)—refused to be discouraged until she received

III. THE DISDAIN OF THE DISCIPLES

- A. The Epitome Of Entitlement—self-righteous, impatient, smug and superior
 - 1. Chauvinistic—prejudiced belief in superiority of your own group, nation, gender
 - 2. Racist (Act 10:34-35)—the Kingdom of God is multi-ethnic
 - 3. Uncharitable—when we don't see that we are them, dehumanize & despise them
- B. <u>Slow Learners</u> (Act 10:15; Rom 14:17, 20b)—*Don't call unclean what God has made clean!*
- IV. <u>THE RESPONSE OF JESUS</u>—His initial response seems out of character.
 - A. The Silence of Jesus (23)—Initially doesn't respond at all.
 - **B.** The Insult from Jesus (24, 26)—Likely verbalizing what the disciples were thinking.
 - C. The Praise of Jesus (28)—She is is held up as an example of great faith.
 - 1. Testing His <u>Disciples' Understanding</u>—teaching on clean and unclean
 - 2. Testing the Woman's Faith—drawing it out for display as an example
- V. THE OVERFLOW OF GOD'S GRACE (Mat 8:11; Jn 6:48-51)—a place at feast with Abraham
 - A. The Blessing of All Nations (Gen 12:1-3; 18:18)
 - **1.** The <u>Nation of Israel</u>—was supposed to be a witness to the world, very limited
 - 2. The Messiah (Gal 3:14, 16)—blessing of Abraham also for Gentiles in Christ
 - **3.** The <u>Church</u> (Eph 2:19-22; Rev 7:9-10)—redeemed from all nations, united in Christ, built together as God's dwelling. People of every nation are included in the Church.
 - **B.** Equality in the Kingdom of God (Rom 2:9-11; Gal 3:28)
 - 1. No one <u>deserves</u> salvation. (Rom 3:9-12; Eph 2:3)—*Equally damned*
 - Jesus saves <u>everyone</u> who comes to Him. (14:14-16; 15:32; Jn 6:37; Act 10:34-35)—*Equally saved*
 - 3. We are citizens of a New Kingdom. (Eph 2:19; Rev 7:9-10) Equal sons and citizens
