Talent Management

Mark 12:30; Matthew 25:14-30

- I. ENTRUSTED WITH TALENTS (14-15)
 - **A. Talents**—originally a sum of money equivalent to 20 years of wages for a laborer
 - 1. **Special Talents**—special abilities (gifting) not common to all people or all Christians
 - a. Uncommon Natural Ability
 - **b. Individual Spiritual Gift** (1 Cor 12:7-11)
 - c. Unique Position or Resource
 - **2.** <u>Common Talents</u>—those we *all* have by virtue of being human and children of God
 - **B. Entrusted** (1 Cor 4:7)
 - 1. It does not belong to you. (1 Cor 6:19-20) God owns it.
 - **2. You are a steward.** You manage someone else's property for their benefit.
 - a. Position of Authority—to act on behalf of the owner
 - **b.** Position of Responsibility—your job, duty, obligation to benefit the owner
 - C. <u>Different Amounts</u> (15) Some can handle more than others.It's not about *how much* you have but about *what you do* with what you have been given.
- II. <u>CALLED TO ACCOUNT</u> (19-30)—answer for what we did with what we were given
 - A. <u>Individual Accountability</u> (Rom 14:10-14; 2 Cor 5:10)—personally to Jesus
 - **B.** <u>Reward for Initiative</u> (21, 23; Phil 3:12-16)—you cared enough to develop and use your talents for God's Kingdom
 - 1. <u>Praise</u>—publically recognized and commended
 - **2.** <u>Promotion</u>—given more responsibility along with commensurate influence, authority, compensation and respect. (*Little things matter!*)
 - **3.** <u>Participation</u>—enter into the Master's joy

- a. Material benefits
- b. Emotional benefits
- c. Relational benefits
- **C.** <u>Punishment for Laziness</u> (26-30)—not for *trying and failing*, but for *making no effort*
 - 1. Rebuke (26)—publically reprimanded and chastised
 - 2. Removal of the Talent (28-29)—lose what you had and didn't use
 - **3. Removal from the Position** (30a)—fired, loss of relationship
 - **4. Regret** (30b)—no one to blame but yourself
- **III.** CALLED TO RELATIONSHIP (Deut 6:4-6; Mat 22:37)—Relationship underlies attitude, which motivates behavior.
 - A. Misjudging the Master's Character (24-25)
 - **1.** A <u>Hard</u> Man—a demanding tyrant, unreasonable, hard to please
 - **2.** A <u>Lucky</u> Man—gets more than he deserves, wealthy privilege
 - B. Revealing the Servant's Motives (18)
 - 1. Fear (25)—I'm afraid of doing the wrong thing so I do no-thing.
 - 2. Resentment (24)—I would rather be working for myself, building my own kingdom.
 - 3. <u>Laziness</u> (26-27)—passive-aggressive sabotage; not just worthless but wicked
 - C. Entering the Master's Joy (21, 23; Jn 15:14-15) Not everyone will be able or willing
 - 1. Share the **Heart** of Jesus. Love what He loves.
 - 2. Share the Mission of Jesus. Embrace His vision, goals and purpose.
 - **3. Share the Work of Jesus.** Experience camaraderie by participation.
 - **4. Share the** <u>Joy</u> **of Jesus.** If you love the Master, His joy will be your joy.
