Betrayed and Deserted

Matthew 26:46-56

I. THE COWARDICE OF MEN

- A. The Cover of Darkness (John 3:19-20; Lk 22:53)—The fear of exposure (bad conscience)
- B. The Guise of a Greeting (48-50)—lip service, hypocrisy
 - 1. The Rouse of Respect (Mat 15:7-8)—"Rabbi," title of respect among religious Jews
 - 2. <u>The Appearance of Affection</u> (Prov 27:6)—a kiss, common courtesy among friends, relatives, or to a person of importance (subject to a king)
- C. The Support of a Crowd (47a, 55; Jn 18:3)—The fear of man, safety in numbers
- D. The Desertion of a Friend (56b; Heb 2:14-15)—The fear of death, run for your life
 - → Our relationship with Jesus is secured by the strength of His love and faithfulness to us, not by the strength of our love and faithfulness to Him!
- II. THE CONFIDENCE OF JESUS (Jn 18:4-8)—He fears neither man nor death.
 - A. <u>He Takes Charge</u>—Jesus is not passive; He's directing the show.
 - 1. He steps up (46)—He goes to meet His betrayer
 - **2.** He speaks up (50, 52, 55)
 - a. He calls out Judas to stop the charade.
 - b. He commands Peter to put away his sword.
 - c. He confronts the crowd with the under-handed nature of their conduct.
 - **B.** He Knows His Power (53; Dan 3:16-18)—we have access to this same power

- 1. The Favor of God—My loving, almighty Father
- 2. The Resources of Heaven—The Angelic Host
- C. <u>He Knows the Plan</u> (Mat 16:21; Mk 9:12; Act 4:23-31)—*He came to atone for our sins by offering Himself in our place*.
 - **1.** He knows the Scripture (54, 56)—Jesus knows the plot. He wrote the script.
 - **2.** He knows His mission (Mat 20:28; Jn 12:27)—
- III. THE CENSURE OF THE SWORD (52; 2 Corinthians 10:3-4)
 - **A.** The Wisdom of Man (Mat 16:23; Isa 53:10-12 & 55:8-9.)—doesn't know the plan of God
 - **B.** The Weapons of the World (2 Corinthians 10:3-4)
 - **1.** Are not the weapons of the <u>Church</u>—We may not use the tactics of the world to do the work of God.
 - **2. Can only bring** <u>death</u>—Jesus brings life and healing.
 - **3. Cannot bring about the Kingdom of God**—God has always been after our hearts.
 - a. Coercion does not convert.
 - b. Faith cannot be forced.
 - c. Love must be <u>freely chosen</u>.
 - C. Our Weapon of Choice (Eph 6:12, 17; Rev 1:16 & 19:15, 21)—the Sword of the Spirit, the Word of God
