## **Lesson D8:** A Rock or a Stumbling Block?

Matthew 16:13-28

## I. THE FAITH OF PETER (13-19)—Peter the Rock

#### A. Praised by Jesus

- 1. Blessed (17a; Rom 8:32; 2 Cor 1:20)—happy, fortunate; commended; God's favor extended to us in Christ
- 2. Renamed (18)—Simon to Peter
- 3. Entrusted (18b-19)—Keys of the Kingdom
- B. Given by God (17b)—Not revealed by man but by my Father in Heaven
  - 1. Human Thought Insufficient—He's a great prophet!
  - 2. Divine Revelation Required (Mat 11:25; Eph 2:8)—Even faith is the gift of God.
- C. Foundational to the Church (18; Eph 2:20)—Peter's testimony that Jesus is the Christ
- II. THE FOLLY OF PETER (20-23; Acts 21:13)—Peter the Stumbling Block
  - A. Rebuked by Jesus sternly and severely
    - 1. Felt Temptation to Avoid Cross—Satan keeps bringing this up.
    - **2. Fatal Misunderstanding of Salvation**—There is no salvation without the cross.
  - B. Misled by Human Wisdom (Isa 55:8-9)—God's plan is bigger
  - C. Used by Satan—to tempt and discourage

## III. THE CHURCH OF CHRIST (18)

- A. Owned by Jesus—Each person will answer to Jesus for their leadership and behavior.
- B. <u>Built by Jesus</u>—He works through His people but it is His work. He will see it through.

### C. Undefeated by Hell

- 1. The Church Will Endure. Jesus will preserve it.
- 2. The Church Will Triumph. The Holy Spirit will empower it.

## IV. The CALL of DISCIPLESHIP (24-28)

- A. The Cost (24-25)—must be chosen intentionally and willingly
  - 1. Deny Yourself (Mk 10:21; 1 Cor 6:19-20)—Relinquish self-will, His desires over yours.
  - 2. Take Up Your Cross—Suffer opposition, persecution for gospel. No cross, no crown.
  - **3.** Follow Jesus—Go where He goes and do what He does. If He suffers, you suffer.
- **B.** <u>The Choices</u> (25-26)
  - 1. Save Your Life for Yourself (25a)—My will, my way
    - **a.** Personal Autonomy—My will be done! I am sovereign over my own life!
    - **b.** Worldly Success and Approval—The world will accept you as its own.
    - **c.** <u>Temporal Comfort</u>—Whatever makes life easy and enjoyable now.
    - → Eventually <u>lose these</u> AND <u>forfeit your soul</u>.
  - 2. <u>Lose Your Life for Jesus</u> (25b)—means more than martyrdom; daily living sacrifice
    - a. Servant of Christ (1 Cor 6:19-20)—His kingdom, His will, His way
    - **b.** Hated by the World (Jn 15:18-21, Jas 4:4)—You forfeit the world's approval
    - **c.** Persecuted for Righteousness (2 Tim 3:12)—You accept temporal suffering
    - → Gain True Life and Eternal Comfort. (Jn 10:10; 2 Cor 1:5 & 4:7; 2 Ths 2:16)
- V. THE IDENTITY OF JESUS (13-16)—"Who do people say that the Son of Man is?"
  - **A. Who do <u>people</u> say that He is?** A prophet. Not sufficient for salvation.
  - **B.** Who does <u>Peter</u> say that He is? The Christ (Messiah), the Son of the living God.
  - **C.** Who do you say that He is? This makes all the difference.
