Jesus' Sorry Friends

Matthew 26:69-27:10

- The Price of the Prophet (Jer 19:1-13; Zech 11:12-13)—thirty pieces of silver, the blood of the innocent, the potter's field and the burial ground...
- The rejection of Christ by the Jewish nation blessing the Gentiles...
- The pathological blindness of legalism...
- Peter's accent ... a Christian who tries to cover his "accent" by cursing and swearing!
- **I. JUDAS' SORRY END** (27:3-10) *Conviction of sin destroys the unrepentant.*
 - A. The Progression of Sin (Jas 1:14-15)—one sin leads to another
 - **1. Greed** (Jn 12:6; 1 Tim 6:10; Col 3:5)—love of money, idolatry
 - a. Embezzling from the Ministry
 - b. Despising Jesus
 - **2.** <u>Hypocrisy</u> (Jn 12:4-6, 13:28-29)—double life
 - a. He looked good to others.
 - b. He <u>hid his heart</u> from everyone.
 - **3.** <u>Betrayal</u> (27:4)—*treachery,* the greatest villainy in all of history.
 - **B.** The Role of Satan (Lk 22:3-6; Jn 13:27)—He can't act alone; he tempts and seduces
 - 1. The devil is <u>real</u>. He is personal, evil, and actively involved in the destruction of souls
 - 2. We are <u>responsible</u>. Persistent, unrepentant sins opens the door for the devil.
 - C. <u>The Despair of Remorse</u> (2 Cor 7:10)—The sad end of one who experiences the conviction of sin without the grace of repentance

- II. <u>PETER'S SORRY BEGINNING</u> (26:58, 69-75) Until the experience of his own failure, Peter was not ready to be the great Apostle that he would later become.
 - A. <u>The Collection of Sins</u>—Sins don't travel alone; they tend to *swarm*.
 - **1. Cowardly** Desertion (26:56; Rev 21:8;)—cowardice and a broken promise
 - 2. Disowning Jesus (Mat 10:33)—public disloyalty
 - **3. Swearing** Falsely (Ex 20:7; Jas 5:12)—profanity and lying (4th Commandment)
 - B. The Dangerous Set-up—attitudes and actions that led to the big disaster
 - **1.** Overconfident in Himself (26:33,35; Prov 28:26; 1 Cor 10:12)—pride Overestimating your own strength is a weakness that Satan is delighted to exploit.
 - 2. Neglect of Prayer (26:41)—lack of spiritual discipline and preparation
 - **3. Following at a** <u>Distance</u> (26:58)—compromised, half-hearted devotion
 - **4. Sitting with the <u>Scoffers</u>** (Ps 1:1; 1 Cor 15:33)—trying to blend in with the world in order to escape persecution for associating with Jesus
 - C. <u>The Piercing Sorrow</u> (Ps 51:17; Mat 5:3-4; 26:75; 2 Cor 7:10; Heb 12:5-6, 10)—brokenhearted mourning over sin
 - D. The Sanctification (Prov 24:16; Rom 8:28; Heb 12:5-6, 10)—God can even use our sin
 - **1.** Humiliation of Pride (Prov 3:34; 1 Pet 5:5-6)
 - 2. Gratitude for Grace (Lk 7:47)
 - 3. <u>Sympathy for Others</u> (Heb 2:17-18)—gentleness and patience

A true child of God might sin greatly, but the conviction of sin is met with true, godly sorrow and results, not in death and destruction, but in repentance and sanctification.
