Question #5: Answer: Why did Jesus call the Father "My God"? Jesus was also the "Son of Man".

Key verses:

Matthew 27:46, "And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, **My God**, **my God**, why hast thou forsaken me?" (Repeated in Mark 15:34.)

John 20:17, "Jesus saith unto her, Touch me not; for I am not yet ascended to my Father: but go to my brethren, and say unto them, I ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to **my God**, and your God."

Revelation 3:12, "Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in the temple of **my God**, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of **my God**, and the name of the city of **my God**, which is new Jerusalem, which cometh down out of heaven from **my God**: and I will write upon him my new name."

How many times did Jesus use the phrase "my God" in these verses?

Jesus is called the "Son of Man" in 85 different verses in the New Testament. That refers to His _____.

Jesus is called "the Son of God" in 45 verses in the New Testament: That refers to His

Jesus was the "God-man". After His Bethlehem birth He was always 100% God and 100% man simultaneously. As He humbled Himself to be a man, He was always obedient to the Father even unto death (Philippians 2:5-11). As a man He set an example for us and called the Father "My God".

Question #6:

1 Corinthians 11:3, "But I would have you know, that the head of every man is Christ; and the head of the woman is the man; and **the head of Christ is God**."

Explanation:

Every organization must have one head to function. Every company, business, factory, sports team, country, state, county, town, marriage, family, church, etc. must have one head. The old saying is true: "Anything with two heads is a monster".

The Trinity also has one Head – The Father. All three members are equal, but the Father is the Head. Christ is in subjection to the Father, now and forever.

1 Corinthians 15:28, "And when all things shall be subdued unto him, then shall the Son also himself be subject unto him that put all things under him, that God may be all in all." (Be sure to read verse 24-27 to keep this verse in context).

The Holy Spirit is so humble, He doesn't even speak of Himself. **John 16:13**, "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he **shall not speak of himself**; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come." He speaks what He is told.

Illustration:
