## **Lesson D14: The Unmerciful Servant**

Matthew 18:21-35; Matthew 6:12

- I. SIN AS DEBT—much bigger than willfully breaking a list of rules we could have kept
  - **A.** The Magnitude of Our Debt to God (24)—a talent was the highest unit of currency; 10,000 talents=several million dollars.
    - 1. The Debt of <u>Law</u>—every time we break the law or fail to keep it God as the <u>Judge</u>: We are morally, legally answerable to Him.
      - **a.** Commission—doing what is forbidden (active)
      - **b.** Omission—failing to perform what is commanded (passive)
    - 2. The Debt of <u>Management</u>—we have squandered His resources ("talents") God as the <u>Owner</u>: We are responsible to manage His resources for His profit.
    - **3.** The Debt of <u>Service</u>—we expect the salary but don't work diligently God as the Employer: He pays salary & benefits; we owe Him good work.
    - **4.** The Debt of <u>Offense</u>—dishonored, committed treachery, failed to pay taxes **God as the King**: He grants title/land & provides protection; we owe honor, loyalty, taxes
    - **5.** The Debt of <u>our Ancestors</u>—original sin; we are born already in debt
      Adam & Eve bound future generations to their debt; Jesus is the only human capable of repaying the debt and redeeming the human family.
  - **B.** The Smallness of Others' Debts to Us (28)—one denarius was the daily wage for workers; this debt was less than 1/100,000 of what the first servant owed!
    - **1. Not saying our hurt is insignificant.** Simply perspective and self-awareness
    - 2. The measure of reality is God. Our true situation seen only in relation to Him

## II. THE CHARACTER OF THE SERVANT

**A.** <u>Unrealistic</u>—still thinks he can pay if he has enough time; overestimation of self Time is not our friend; it allows us to accumulate *more* debt!

- **B.** <u>Unreasonable</u>—total lack of self-awareness and empathy
  - 1. <u>High Expectations</u> of Others—excuse self but don't give same courtesy to others
  - **2.** Harsh Treatment of His Debtor—legal but not justified, beneficial or charitable
- **C.** <u>Ungrateful</u>—He feels entitled to mercy he received. Gratitude is a product of Humility.
  - 1. Does not feel the enormity of his own debt
  - 2. Does not truly appreciate the mercy shown to him
- **D. Wicked** (32)—Unforgiveness is sin; it dishonors God and despises His mercy.
- III. THE CHARACTER OF GOD THE FATHER (35; Psalm 103:4)
  - **A.** He is Loved for His Mercy. He is kind, patient and willing to forgive.
  - **B.** He is Feared for His Justice. He will call us to account.
    - 1. He does not excuse; He forgives.
    - 2. Forgiveness costs Him.
    - 3. He will be glorified either for His mercy or for His justice.
  - **C.** He is Served by our Gratitude. Not to earn forgiveness but because forgiveness given
    - 1. Because of His forgiveness, we are *able* to serve Him.
    - 2. Because of the price He paid, we should be more eager to serve Him well.
  - **D.** <u>He is Honored by our Emulation</u>. Forgiveness is the Christian way of life.

Those who have *truly received* (experienced and understood) mercy will aspire to holiness and extend mercy to others.

- 1. Be holy because God is holy.
- 2. Be merciful because God is merciful.
