Leah: Ugly Sister And Unloved Wife

(Genesis 29:1-30:21; 49:29-32)

I. THE WORTH OF A WOMAN

- **A.** The Standard (29:17; 30:20)—What makes us worthy?
 - **1. Beauty**—sex appeal, romance; I will be chosen and loved.
 - **2.** <u>Fertility</u>—*motherhood, descendents;* I will be respected, valued.
- **B.** <u>The Judge</u>—upon whose approval we rest our identity and worth Allowing any creature to define us and determine our value is recipe for misery.

II. THE PAIN OF LEAH

- A. <u>OVERLOOKED</u> (Ps 139:17-18)—unnoticed, overshadowed
 - **1. God is watching.** (Gen 29:31-33; Ps 33:18-19 & 34:15)
 - 2. <u>Jesus understands</u>. (Isa 53:2)
- **B.** <u>UNDERVALUED</u> (1 Sam 16:7; Prov 31:30)
 - 1. Physical Beauty Is Overrated by Men.
 - a. It is <u>deceptive</u>. A beautiful form can hide an ugly personality.
 - b. It won't last. An unstable foundation upon which to base our worth
 - 2. Spiritual Beauty Is Prized by God. genuine, eternal, cultivated
- **C.** <u>UNLOVED</u> (29:30-31)
 - 1. Jacob did not want Leah.
 - 2. God loved her.
 - a. Noted by God (Prov 30:21-23)—not fair that she was an unloved wife
 - b. Favored by God
 - c. Loved by Her Children (Gen 30:14)

III. THE STRUGGLE OF LEAH (Gen 30:8, 15)

- **A.** <u>Insecurity</u>—Am I enough?
- B. <u>Competition</u>—female rivalry when we could have friendship, support
- **C.** <u>Frustration</u> (Hosea 2:6, 14-20)—*No mere man can bear the weight of worship; only Jesus is worthy!*
 - 1. Idolatry (misplaced worship) will always disappoint.
 - 2. God meets us in our disappointment.

IV. THE ANSWER OF JESUS

- **A.** <u>He has established our worth</u>. (Mat 15:41; 28:7-8; Mk 15:41; Lk 8:1-3; Acts 16:13; Gal 3:28; 1 Pet 1:18-19)
 - 1. **By His Example**—granted equal dignity and respect to women
 - 2. By His Blood—no distinction between male & female
- **B.** He makes us beautiful. (Ecc 3:11; Isa 61:3)
 - **1.** He <u>sees</u> your beauty. (Gen 1:27; Ps 45:11, 13)—unique expression of God's beauty
 - **2.** He <u>perfects</u> your beauty. (Eph 5:25-32)—washes away sins, covers our deficiencies
 - **3.** He <u>delights</u> in your beauty. (Ps 45:11; Eph 5:27; Jude 1:24)— presents you without fault and *with great joy*.
- C. <u>He is the THE MAN</u> whose love is <u>worth everything</u>. (Ps 68:11 [NIV]; Lk 7:38; Jn 12:3-4)

- 4. What great honors does God bestow upon Leah? (See Gen 49:29-31 and Mat 1:1-3.)
- 5. Now think about your own life.
 - a.) What makes you feel inferior and insecure as a woman?
 - b.) About what do you find yourself thinking, "If only I had..., life would be good!" or "My life can never be right unless or until..."?
 - c.) When you think about it, what drives this desire? What are you looking to this person or thing to do for you?
 - d.) Who or what stands in the way of this desire being fulfilled? (Who do you blame?)
 - e.) What incredible blessings has God given you? Are you able to fully enjoy them? Why or why not?
- 6. How can you tell when a desire is legitimate and God-honoring and when it crosses the line into idolatry?
